WORLD MISSION - ALBANIA

On Tuesday the 26th November a big earthquake struck with a 6.4 magnitude, followed by many hourly aftershocks, some of those up to 5 on the Richter scale, an event that hardly made the news in this country. To date it would appear 51 people have lost their lives, 900 are injured and thousands without homes. The areas hardest hit are Durres, Thumane, Shijak and Tirana.

It would appear that 4 churches are no longer able to meet in their buildings and the evangelical community is asking for 4 large tents seating 100-200 people so that they can continue meeting regularly. Churches across the country are mobilising with practical help and personnel to show God's love.
